



TONY'S REFLECTION A VOICE TO RECOGNIZE

Marriage therapists relate that in a thriving marriage, one can predict in advance what their spouse will say and do in a given situation. As the marriage excels in intimacy both spouses inevitably obtain voice recognition of each. One writer mentioned that if she were presented with a thousand male voices all saying "hello" with her husband's voice implanted at voice number 899, she'd be able to pick out her husband's voice with relative ease. When asked why, her answer was simple – "After spending ample time with my husband and listening to his voice, I know his tone and expression almost instinctively."

In today's Gospel, we are presented with a visual of two competing voices speaking to the sheep. The sheep are situated in a sheepfold. In ancient times, the sheepfold was a stone enclosure with one entryway. The structure was used to protect the flock of sheep from thieves and predators. As humble followers of Christ, we stand in the position of the sheep in the sheepfold – that is the church. But, sadly Jesus warns us that there exists would-be pretenders masquerading as His voice in order to steal and destroy the sheep. Jesus alludes that rather than enter the gate these pretenders "climb in another way." Yet, because the true shepherd knows His sheep intimately and calls them by name, the sheep stay with the good shepherd's voice rather than follow the suspicious stranger's call. In fact, later in John's Gospel Jesus plainly says, "My sheep hear my voice; I know them and they follow me."

The crucial question remains: how do we distinguish Jesus's voice today from the cacophony of noise of other "voices" in society? Just like the wife who knew her husband's voice the answer simply is by spending time with Him. The more time we devote to prayer, Scripture, Adoration, and the Mass, the more Jesus's teaching, His utterances, and His voice will become ingrained in us. If we consume Our Lord into us intimately and reverently in the Eucharist, His inner being, which contains His voice, will continue to reverberate in us like a sacred echo that won't leave.

It should be noted, that this concept of consuming and recognizing also works in reverse. If instead of soaking ourselves in Christ, we fixate more on our phones, TVs, or any other modern apparatus, then we'll have effectively muted Jesus's voice, in turn, not recognizing Him from the other talking heads of the world. In this dark setting, Jesus's words and teaching won't resonate into our psyche.

There are enough vocal "influencers" today telling us how we should live – it's enough to make your head spin. What Christ is alluding to: turn down the volume of outside opinions and conversely turn up the volume of His voice. As we attune ourselves to His voice and mannerisms, then His teachings become clearer to us in these confusing times.
