

TONY'S REFLECTION BURIED TREASURE THIS WAY

As we celebrate The Transfiguration, I'm reminded of that scene in Lord Of The Rings when the prophet-like character "Gandalf The Grey," dramatically returned as "Gandalf The White" blinding the Fellowship upon his arrival. Interestingly, the author of this story, J.R.R. Tolkien, was a devout Catholic and acknowledged how he implanted the biblical narrative throughout the story.

When God breaks into our world, at first, His glory stupefies us. We can't fathom God's essence partly because God is on a whole different playing field than us. While human beings have some aspect of goodness, truth, and beauty, God does not have goodness, truth, or beauty. Rather, God is goodness, truth, and beauty. Therefore, when God manifests Himself to people in Scripture, it utterly shocks them as they don't have the reasoning to comprehend God.

High on the holy mountain in today's Gospel, the true identity of Jesus is fully revealed in His Transfiguration. Standing between Moses and the prophet Elijah, Jesus is the bridge that joins God's Law with God's prophets. This announcement of Jesus's identity jolts the disciples down to the ground. God's love and splendor are so strong it brings us into a stupor. Here, we fall to our knees as when ultimate light (God) comes before darkness (us), it can be a jarring experience.

Peter becomes flabbergasted by Christ's Transfiguration. He knows something brilliant is going on, but he doesn't grasp the full significance of the situation. He awkwardly suggests making three booths (or tabernacles) for this heavenly experience. Peter wanted to make three tabernacles – one for each prophet. But Jesus is no mere prophet. He is the unique Tabernacle of God.

While heaven does not directly respond to Peter's child-like request, the voice of the Father speaks: "This is my chosen Son. Listen to him!" A simple statement, but it yields enormous consequences. These instructions to "listen to Him" are presented to us today. Whether you know it or not, you are listening to some entity throughout your day on what to think about, how to act, how to feel, etc. This entity can range from your desires, other people, society in general, or God. In a sense, God is saying to turn down the volume of listening to the self, others, and the world and turn up the volume to listen to Christ in prayer, Scripture, and most importantly in the Eucharist.

When personification of the good, the true, and the beautiful breaks into our fallen mundane world, those on the receiving end can't handle it. This jolt from God also illuminates God's desire to change us drastically. Just as God created the caterpillar to transform into the butterfly, Jesus' transfiguration is meant to shockingly transform us. For if we "listen to Him," He will convert us from sinners to saints.
