PRAY THE ROSARY AFTER 8 A.M. DAILY MASS





TONY'S REFLECTION DO NOT BE AFRAID

In the depths of the Great Depression, Franklin Roosevelt famously announced, "The only thing we have to fear is fear itself." Fear occurs when we encounter something that we can't control or that we think will harm us. Fear is a natural human response that arises as a defense mechanism in the face of potential danger. While not the same, fear and anxiety are related. Fear is a physical response, whereas anxiety is a mental or emotional response to something that may negatively harm us. Fear has been a constant emotion that has been a part of the human scene ever since the fall of man. Today, it seems fear has skyrocketed across our landscape. An estimated 31% of Americans experience an anxiety disorder in their life.

In the Gospel today, Jesus assures us three times not to be afraid of earthly trappings but rather to fear being in hell, separated from God. "Do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather fear him who can destroy both soul and body in hell" (Matthew 10:28).

Three years ago, this country was stepped in the midst of fear of COVID to the point we shut down our normal way of living. Today, Jesus is reminding us to put aside fear and anxiety toward physical obstacles while having a healthy fear of spiritual realities. If a person doesn't fear sin, yet falls under the control of fearing a physical thing – be it cancer or even death itself – this fear will inevitably pull them away from the faith. Why? Because a physical ailment has no power to separate you from God. To become paranoid over a physical condition more than a divine relationship would be analogous to me fearing a bad rash because it negatively affects my relationship with my wife. This doesn't make any sense as the physical condition holds no sway over the sacramental relationship. But, sin, on the other hand, does have the ability to separate you from God. Therefore, we should fear sin and losing our connection with God over a mere physical disease.

Yet, if we are honest, we know that deep down, we tend to place more of our fear into the problems in this world. The picture today presents a sad reversal of the biblical message in which we've become afraid of that which we shouldn't ultimately fear (our health, the unknown), and we've become indifferent to the only thing we should be fearful of (separation from God). By casting aside the supernatural perspective, the material now takes precedence. Here, one's order has devolved, and fear becomes out of control. And God assuredly does not want us to be a constant worry wart about life. However, having one's foot situated in the spiritual landscape allows us to be above the fray of the fear and chaos going on in the physical world.

In prayer, the Lord can help us turn down the volume of fear so we can catch a glimmer of the peace He promises us.
