A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JUSTIN RAINES

My Dear Friends in Christ,

At the end of June, I completed my first year of service here at Saint Matthew. It has been a good occasion for me to reflect on how blessed I am to be your pastor. I am grateful because God has blessed us with a great parish and school community. Saint Matthew is in a position to do great things for Christ in our community. My vision is that we are a parish strong in our Catholic faith, living the Gospel, and being nourished by the Lord in the Eucharist, so that we can be a beacon of evangelization, hope, and blessing in our community.

One way that we can share with others in Middle Tennessee is through the Bishop's Annual Appeal for Ministries (BAAM). The BAAM is the primary way many ministries are funded in the Diocese of Nashville. This fundraising effort does not cover administrative expenses of the diocesan offices, but rather supports vital ministries that benefit the Church throughout the diocese. These ministries include seminarian education, so that we can have priests to celebrate the sacraments in the future, Catholic Charities, so that we can take care of our neighbors in need, and Catholic schools and youth ministry, so that we can form our young people in Christ to one day evangelize our society.

I would like to ask you, a parishioner of Saint Matthew, to prayerfully consider making a gift to the BAAM. Our goal in this year's appeal is \$118,390. To date, we have raised \$53,590 and are 45% to our goal. While we have had a great start to the campaign, there is still work to be done.

JOIN THE A/V MINISTRY



TONY'S REFLECTION GLORY FROM SUFFERING

Human nature abhors suffering. We go out of our way to avoid even the slightest distress. Today, cars come equipped with heated seats and heated steering wheels so we can avoid those brief moments of chills on a winter day. Our culture abounds with products and services that are designed to eliminate suffering and increase comfort. Therefore, when we hear blunt messages from Christ about denying ourselves and taking up our cross, it catches us off guard. In fact, Jesus' words of His own suffering caught Peter off guard.

Last week, Peter's confession of Jesus as the Son of God was inspired by the Father. In this exchange, Peter's natural instincts object to a suffering Messiah. On his own, Peter cannot see the spiritual necessity of Jesus' passion for sinners. When Peter denies Jesus' mission, Jesus' response is striking: "Get behind me, Satan!" This conversation portrays that becoming a hindrance to God's will implies a demonic source attempting to overthrow God's plan.

To follow Jesus is to take up a cross, to deny yourself your priorities, preferences, and comforts. It is to be willing to give it all up, even life itself, for the sake of His Gospel. Yet, while the cross is a stumbling block for us, the whole point of denying ourselves, accepting our cross, and giving up our life is that God's suffering eventually leads to glory.

Because Peter is so alarmed to hear the first part of Jesus' plan to suffer, he missed the second part of Jesus' sentence, "and on the third day be raised." Oftentimes the emotional shock of turmoil blinds us to see that God will use it for good in the end.

Jesus did not say His hour is near for him to die, but to be glorified. He grouped Calvary and his triumph together as He would do after His resurrection when speaking to His disciples on the road to Emmaus: "Was not it to be expected that the Christ should undergo these sufferings and enter into His glory." (Luke 24:26)

A key hinge in the spiritual life is to fixate more on the upcoming glory than the current suffering. In our faith, we don't just suffer for the sake of suffering. Much like the agony in a workout leads to a good effect – a healthy body – so too the temporary distress in the soul can lead to its sanctification. While Jesus indicates that suffering and self-denial are essential to the Christian life (Rom 8:17, Col 1:24) it is vital for us to see that the suffering has a point to it. When we fixate on God and unite our suffering to Him, He will point us to the glory that awaits us.
