




# **40 DAYS FOR LIFE**


# **UPCOMING CURSILLO RETREATS**

### TONY'S REFLECTION

# WHERE DO ACTIONS COME FROM?

You are probably familiar with the phrase, "Actions speak louder than words." This expression insinuates that people's actions display their real attitudes rather than what they say. But when we look at people's actions, we have to look at the whole picture and what leads to those actions.

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus presents us with two sons that correspond to the two groups of people Ezekiel describes in the first reading. If we add up these two groups, we have: virtuous ones who say they'll do God's work but end up not doing it. Then we have the wicked ones who say they won't do God's work; however, they end up repenting and eventually do God's work. Whereas the tax collectors and prostitutes entering the kingdom of God parallel to the son who refused to go into the vineyard at first but afterward did, the Pharisees resemble the son who promised to work but did not. It's important to emphasize that the tax collectors and prostitutes repented and changed their lives. Jesus is not saying that lifestyles of extortion and sexual promiscuity are compatible with the kingdom of God. On the other side of the coin, the Pharisees that Jesus castigates were people who were trained in virtue at a young age but gave lip service to acting out this virtue for God. Rather than doing God's work, they spent their time finding legalistic loopholes for their own gain.

Here, we are presented with one son who says he'll be faithful but does no work to prove it and another son who says he won't be faithful but then ends up doing God's work. What is the difference between these two sons?

Modern psychology illuminates that your experiences drive the content of your thoughts, which, in turn, your thoughts control your emotions, habits, character, basically everything in your life. Therefore, a person's life can be boiled down to thinking and doing. What we do or don't do first starts with a thought. This is why spiritual writers emphasize rather than look at the service-level words of a person; we must look at their interior – the source from which their words originate. In his book, "The Soul of the Apostolate", Jean-Baptiste notes that virtuous works should be nothing but an overflow from the interior life. As he wrote, "Our interior life ought to be the stem, filled with vigorous sap, of which our works are the flowers."

Therefore, before one can move to do the work of God, they must go through an interior conversion in which they contemplate God. The interior life is the struggle to put all our thoughts in prayer and meditation toward God. In one son, there was a transformation in his disposition, which then resulted in a change in his active movement toward God's work and away from his work. In the other son, there was no such interior conversion. Let us strive to delve into our interior life so we can become active in God's work.
