FATHER RYAN LEGACY GALA






ADVENT WORD STUDY | AGAPE: "LOVE"

TONY'S REFLECTION WHAT IS JOY?

The third Sunday of Advent is traditionally called "Gaudete Sunday." Gaudete is the Latin word meaning "rejoice." With the word "rejoice" comes the concept of joy. Therefore, the prominent theme this week in Advent is joy. But what exactly is joy? Into every life comes glimpses of joy - the birth of a child, a wedding, a moment of peace in a hectic day, the awareness of God's presence in one's life. Yet these moments come and go and seem to get buried by the stresses of life.

True joy—the underlying peace that lasts despite the pressures of life—is often confused with happiness, a more transitory emotion inspired by fleeting events. Certain things bring momentary happiness to people, but they fade away, whereas joy is abiding and permanent. Happiness is circumstantial because it comes from the word "happenstance." Circumstances come and go – you have comfort then you don't. As Father Mike Schmitz sums up, "We long for happiness, but we're made for joy."

A psychologist for University of California, Berkeley mentioned that our idea of happiness centers around the self. I need ABC, then I'm happy. We have a false concept of happiness as a heightened sense of euphoria. Therefore, we think if we don't get this feeling of euphoria, we must not be happy. Here, we get into this endless trap of pursuing happiness in our consumer-crazed world. But, if we understand what joy is, we can approach any situation with a sense of balance, hope, acceptance, and understanding that God is with us. Scripture repeatedly indicates to "rejoice in all circumstances." Therefore, in any place in life, in any state, you can have joy that is not dependent on your comfort level. The Catechism defines joy as the "abiding and pervasive sense of well-being." So, it is still possible to have joy if you are in the middle of a crisis. Why can you have an abiding and pervasive sense of well-being in the midst of suffering? One answer, Jesus.

G.K. Chesterton described joy as "the gigantic secret of the Christian." Why? Because until Christ came along, you either believed in happenstance or you believed in the gods. The pagan gods are vindictive and don't care about you. However, Jesus reveals the very heart of who God is. Our God is three persons in one. He is constant. He is here. He loves you in all circumstances. Therefore, His "sense of well-being," His joy never goes away. Regardless of what happens to you, you can know that God loves you and that His joy is present even amid pain and suffering (see James 1:2).

Scripture reveals Christ as a person of joy despite His trials. At the Last Supper, Jesus referred to His joy: "These things I have spoken to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be made full" (John 15:11). As John the Baptist proclaimed on the coming of Christ, "My joy is now filled," let us experience joy today as we await the arrival of Christ on Christmas day.


CONFIRMATION RETREAT
