



A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JUSTIN RAINES

Dear People of Saint Matthew Parish,

In the first reading for Christmas Mass "during the night," we hear from the Prophet Isaiah, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; upon those who dwelt in the land of gloom a light has shone [. . .] For a child is born to us, a son is given us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace." I think that this beautifully captures the tone of our Christmas celebration. While Easter is our great holy day, our day of triumph and victory, the day we celebrate the accomplishment of our redemption, Christmas is our great feast of hope. Our fallen world had lain in darkness for an untold number of centuries, with only the people of Israel holding on to God's promise of a messiah, a redeemer. Then a child was born, who was God-made-man, and who was destined to save the world. A light began to shine in the darkness, a light that the darkness can never overcome. God fulfilled his promise.



Christmas is the last of our holy days that still enjoys wide popular celebration by society around us. Christmas is celebrated even by those who are not actively practicing their Christian faith. Although popular celebrations may take a different emphasis than ours, I think the fact that Christmas is so widely celebrated, that even today there are Christmas trees and lights around our neighborhoods and public spaces, tells us that people are longing for hope, hope that only Jesus Christ can bring.

Wherever you are in life, remember that God always fulfills his promises, and that there is always hope with the Lord Jesus. Let the light of Christ penetrate into the darkness, and know that there is no darkness that can ever overcome it. Let the Lord fill you with hope.

May each and every one of you have a Merry Christmas, full of joy at the birth of the Lord Jesus and enlightened with his hope.

A YEAR IN REVIEW

"AND BEHOLD, I AM WITH YOU ALWAYS." - MATTHEW 28:20

This is the promise of Christ as told in the Gospel of our patron, Saint Matthew. It is also the promise of our parish. As our mission states, "We invite, welcome, love, and support all of God's people." This principle guides all of us at the parish, including our ministry leaders and volunteers. Take a look below to see some of the ways our ministries invited, welcomed, loved, and supported God's people in 2023.

- The **MEN'S CLUB** served more than 450 meals at our fish fries, 140 guests at Breakfast with Santa, and countless community members at their other events throughout the year.
- The **WOMEN'S CLUB** returned this year to serve the women of the parish, welcoming more than 60 women at their relaunch event in May. Since their return, the Women's Club has hosted numerous, well-attended events, including a blind book exchange, a paint-along party, and their inaugural Gift Dash dinner and fundraiser.
- Our ST. GIANNA CIRCLE MOTHERS MINISTRY, now in its third year at Saint Matthew, continued to grow and provide a place of belonging for the mothers in our parish and the surrounding community. They hosted many events to serve the community, including the Praying As A Family workshop to kick off the year; the Stages of Motherhood panel, featuring a panel of mothers with 45 children between them; the inaugural Mother-Son Night of Fun, which welcomed nearly 300 guests; the Family Advent Wreath-Making Event; and The Manger, our parish's Christmasgiving effort.
- The **SAINT MATTHEW HAITI MINISTRY** continued to provide financial support for our sister parish, Our Lady of Miracles, in Gobert, Haiti. They hosted their 13th annual Well Played: A Songwriters Night, which raised more than \$30,000 for our sister parish and aided in the construction of six new classrooms for the parish school.
- The TROOPS OF ST. GEORGE welcomed 64 members in its first year at Saint Matthew.
- Our RESPECT FOR LIFE MINISTRY
 raised \$7,697 in its annual Baby Bottle
 Drive, benefitting women experiencing
 crisis and unplanned pregnancies at Mulier
 Care.
- The **FAMILY SERVICE MINISTRY** continued to bring families together to serve the community at large. Throughout the year, members of the ministry stuffed and distributed 106 blessing bags to the homeless population in Nashville; collected 108 Boxes of Joy to donate to Cross Catholic Outreach; cooked dinner for 35 residents at The Ronald McDonald House in April; and continued to serve and bring joy to the residents at NHC Place at the Trace at various events.

- Our **LITURGICAL MINISTRIES** helped to support our priests at all of our Masses throughout the year. This year, we trained two new Ministers of Ceremony, 50 new altar servers, and numerous lectors, hospitality ministers, and EMHC's. Most notably, our Liturgical Ministries are seeing an influx of volunteers coming from the youth of the parish, who are eager to learn the ropes and prepare to lead the parish in the future.
- Our **SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT de PAUL** volunteers made 29 home visits to neighbors requesting assistance for rent, utilities, gasoline, car repairs, etc. Our Conference paid \$21,308 in back rent to landlords to prevent evictions, dispensed more than \$4,000 in food and clothing to neighbors from its pantry, and rescued two families with children living in their cars and partnered with social agencies to get them into subsided housing. They also hosted their fifth annual Friends of the Poor Walk/Run, raising a record \$15,000 in sponsorships and donations.
- Our **ROOM IN THE INN MINISTRY** served more than 120 guests in 2023 and expanded their offerings for the guests to include showers and haircuts at certain events.

These are just a few of the ways our ministries helped to advance the mission of our parish throughout the year. We are so grateful to our ministry leaders and volunteers for being such exemplary ambassadors for Saint Matthew.
