TONY'S REFLECTION

THE SEASON OF PREPARATION

Welcome to Advent! The word Advent originates from a Latin word "Adventus" which means "coming" or "arrival," and invokes the English word "adventure." Indeed, we can view preparing for Christ's arrival as an adventure itself. In this adventure, several pressing questions stir in the minds of the faithful. Is He coming? When's He coming? Am I prepared? The U.S. Coast Guard's motto is "semper paratus" which means "always prepared." It behooves us to realize that if the Coast Guard is not prepared, then lives are in jeopardy. As we enter Advent, a similar scenario plays out.

Today, Jesus provides us with a crucial announcement on the importance of being vigilant. As with other parables, each character represents a corresponding reality we can witness in the spiritual life. The "gatekeeper" placed on watch refers to the clergy, especially the successor of St. Peter himself. The clergy are to be on watch, warning and encouraging the rest of the "servants" about the return of the master. When the gatekeepers get distracted with temporal causes rather than the Gospel, then the servants will likely become complacent. Similarly, we servants also need to be filled with a holy sense of urgency for Christ's arrival. Being consumed in the hubbub in our secular society, it's easy to become distracted by countless trivial matters that have nothing to do with Christ's imminent return. Therefore, a large part of our life needs to be fixated on the spiritual life drenched with prayer and the sacramental life. The man who has his spiritual affairs in order shows no reason to panic when Christ enters the scene.

As Dr. John Bergsma illustrates, the sequence "evening, midnight, cockcrow, morning" can be understood spiritually for different moments in the life of the Church: "evening" are those ages when the Church's influence in society is waning and corruption within is growing; "midnight," when the Church is eclipsed and suffers persecution; "cockcrow," when there are hopeful signs and the beginnings of reform; "morning," when the Church experiences growth. We don't know in which kind of age Christ will return, so it's incumbent on us to be constantly vigilant.

As we wait for the Lord, it is best to be busy with the work that God has left in our charge: doing our professional work with excellence; fulfilling our duties to family with care and love; speaking of Christ to any who will listen; living a lifestyle of prayer, modesty, and acts of self-denial. If we are busy about these things, we can anticipate the coming of Christ with joy.
