





TONY'S REFLECTION

WHAT TO DO WITH OUR TALENTS?

Some years ago, a movie was released called *For Greater Glory* depicting the struggle for religious freedom for the Catholics of Mexico. The movie depicts how the communist government was violently oppressing the Catholic faith in the 1920's. The rallying cry of the persecuted Mexican Catholics was "Viva Cristo Rey!" which means "Long Live Christ the King!" For many of them, these were the last words out of their mouths before their violent deaths. Here, faithful men boldly proclaimed that Christ was king of the world, king of their lives in the face of looming death.

Today, we celebrate the kingship of Christ. Unlike the vast majority of human kings, Christ the King came to give up His life for his followers rather than protect it. In the storyline of the Gospel, the people have it backward. They claim if He is truly king, God will save Him from death on the cross. So, they taunt Him. What they don't understand is that this king didn't come to save Himself but to save them—and us. By the blood of His cross, Jesus reveals His kingship—not in protecting His own life, but in offering it as a ransom for ours.

The ingship of Christ is best understood through Jesus' conversation with the Roman governor Pontius Pilate before Pilate condemned Him to death by crucifixion. When Pilate questioned Jesus about His kingship, Jesus did not deny that He is a king. He explained, however, the unique nature of His kingship - one that "does not belong to this world" (Jn 18: 36). The heart of Christ's kingdom is not of this world. It is in the next. Yet, how we live and the teachings we embrace in this world show that we either follow the King or do not. While political involvement is a civic duty of Catholics, we are not ultimately fighting for some political order but for holiness, for communion with God, for the salvation of souls, and eternal life. This is Christ's kingdom. Any other goal is far too low. Jesus went out to tell Pilate that part of His kingship is "to testify to the truth," (Jn 18: 37), freeing all mankind from slavery to the deceptions by which Satan would lead us into sin and eternal death.

In Christ's kingship, one grasps the right order of all things — the sacramental, the moral, the natural, and political order. Christ conquers the disorder introduced into the world by the rebellion of our first parents against the will of God for us and for the world. The obedience of God the Son reestablishes and restores the original communion of man with God and, therefore, peace in the world.

Today, we acclaim Christ the King of our lives and of our world, and we offer Him the worship which He alone, among all kings, merits.

RISE COMMUNITY NIGHT


