
CHILDREN'S NATIVITY PAGEANT




OH, COME LET US ADORE HIM

TONY'S REFLECTION DO AS I SAY, NOT AS I DO

Parents often catch themselves using the trendy phrase to their kids, "Do as say, not as I do." While this phrase can be taken as a hypocritical statement, the authenticity depends on the honesty of the person making it. The acknowledgment embedded in the phrase "not imitate my behavior" implies that the person is imperfect and makes mistakes, and because he acknowledges mishaps, one should follow his learned advice. Picture an older gentleman telling a teenager not to smoke all the while, the older person smokes a cigarette not because he is being hypocritical but because through his mistakes and recognition of his addiction, he is passing on sound advice to the younger person.

Knowing all that, today's Gospel reading has a different take because Jesus talks about God-given words. Here, Jesus tells the people to listen to the Pharisee's teaching, but don't follow their actions. Jesus acknowledges that the Pharisees have God-given teaching authority as they had authentically received their authority from the "chair" or office of Moses. As we saw from the readings two weeks ago, God appoints certain leaders who carry heavenly authority even though the majority of their actions in no way reflect God's approval. In short, God uses imperfect people to usher in divine providence. When we keep in mind the Catholic staple that priests are "in the person of Christ," this concept becomes clear. While priests' actions won't be perfect and certainly don't match Christ's actions perfectly, the priests' words carry divine authority when he says at the Mass, "This is my body given up for you." Here, the priest exists as a sacred instrument to allow Christ's words and actions to become manifested.

To be sure, as laity, we don't carry divine authority in our words, but here is where our actions can come into play. As the popular phrase suggests, "Actions speak louder than words." Our actions can relay God's message – especially to children who tend to learn most by imitation. As one priest told me, "Don't be so concerned that your kids don't listen to you. Be more concerned that they watch you."

Life is a dramatic dance of saying and doing in which we attempt to use the right words at the right time coupled with the right actions at the right time. Our sins inevitably hinder these efforts and display the interior struggle that St. Paul expressed he goes through (Romans 7:19-25). Let us remember the one who had perfect words and perfect actions is Christ. Therefore, if we allow Him to use us as an instrument, His words and actions will eventually take shape in us.

Our active receptivity to what God sows in the Mass bursts and blooms and matures in our outward actions in the sacred precincts of church, home, and out in the wider world we are commissioned to transform. As we approach Him with conviction and reverence in the Mass, He will put His words and actions into us.
