
FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION - NOVEMBER 3

TONY'S REFLECTION THE GREATEST COMMANDMENT

Jesus keeps dodging his opponents' dubious traps. This week, a cunning lawyer asked Him which of the 613 commandments is the greatest. Without batting an eye, Jesus responded that it is to love God with all your heart, soul, and mind, while adding that the second greatest commandment is to love the other as yourself. Here, Jesus asserts that the 613 commandments in the Old Testament are distilled into two prescriptions – love God and love your neighbor.

The linking of loving the other underneath loving God shows how they flow together. We can't love our neighbor if we can't love God first. And we can't love God - whom we can't see if we don't love our neighbor - whom we can see. Precisely because our neighbor is an image of God, we must love them as all human love flows from loving God.

Catholicism has long taught that love is not reducible to a feeling or warm sentimentality. Rather, as St. Thomas Aquinas put it in concrete terms, "Love is to will the good of the other."

As Scott Hahn is fond of saying, "Love without suffering is vain, emotional platitudes. What proves that love is genuine is one's ability to suffer for the other." Therefore, embedded in the formula of love is that the self must endure a trial to will the good of the other. In Mother Teresa's noble peace speech, she said, "For love to be real it must hurt." Jesus indicated that in love, the self would suffer to some degree in willing the good of the other. "Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for the beloved" (John 15:13). Almost every time the word "love" surfaces in the Bible, it is associated with self-sacrifice or suffering. Therefore, where there is no sacrifice, there is no love. As the 1976 song by Nazareth declares rather pointedly, "Love Hurts."

It follows that if love is to will the good of the other, at times, this process won't feel comfortable. Because in willing the good of the other, you have to face difficult conversations with loved ones when they've gone astray, similar to the painful encounters invoked at an intervention with an addict. However, such arduous experiences paradoxically allow the person's faith to grow. Indeed, the Christian pedigree is one of hardship, suffering, and martyrdom.

Psychology reveals that often, we treat others kindly primarily so that the other, in turn, will give us praise. However, this formula is a fake version of love, for such moves are tantamount to a strategic self-interest move such as "I scratch your back, you scratch my back." As Bishop Barron puts it, "Truly to love is to move outside of the black hole of one's egotism, to resist the centripetal force that compels one to assume the attitude of self-protection." Love is a total gift of self-sacrifice to God and the other. While the greatest commandment is not the easiest commandment, it will get you closest to God.
