
## **40 DAYS FOR LIFE**

## TONY'S REFLECTION DON'T SHOOT THE MESSENGER

You've probably heard that repeated phrase, "Don't shoot the messenger." This phrase insinuates that the person who delivers bad news to people is not well-liked. It becomes especially disturbing for the messenger if you give powerful people bad news. In 1989, Congress had to enact specific laws to protect whistle-blowers because of the violent threats they would receive. Here, we must ask why the messenger receives so much hostility.

Bishop Fulton Sheen once observed, "The good repent on knowing their sin; the evil become angry when their sin is discovered." What Bishop Sheen is getting at is that there is a movement toward the fact of one's sin – a person either works to get rid of the sin or becomes irritated at this discovery of the sin. Enraged at the sin's discovery, they seek to remove the very entity that exposes their sin. This spiritual insight parallels Jesus' assessment in the parable of the wicked tenants. In this parable, the tenants of a vineyard end up killing the son of the vineyard owner because he is delivering news they don't want to hear.

The basic meaning of the parable boils down to: the vineyard is Jerusalem, the tenants are the chief priests and leaders of Israel. The servants sent to the vineyard are the Old Testament prophets; the son is Jesus Himself; the vineyard owner is God the Father. Therefore, the judgment on the tenants is a prediction of the destruction of Jerusalem which was to happen within a generation (AD 70).

It should be noted that the Old Testament prophets didn't have great news for the kings and rulers of Israel. Isaiah told them, "Your hands are full of blood!" (Isaiah 1:15) Hosea told them their hands are mingled with blood (Hosea 4:2) and Micah mentioned they are building up the city with blood (Micah 3:10). Prophets that provided dire news to Israel's kings tended to have a short life span.

Besides not liking the Son's message, this parable also shows us that Israel's leaders were obsessed with acquiring God's inheritance for their own power, prestige, and income. They didn't view God's inheritance as a beautiful overflow to being in union with God but merely viewed it for their personal advantage. Any threat to the inheritance's treasures needed to be removed so they could reap the rewards.

In a similar vein, people may want to kill off their Catholic faith, bury it under the rug so they can continue in their sins, and acquire their version of pleasure. As Jesus announced, "Light has come into the world, and men loved their darkness rather than the light because their deeds were evil." (John 3:19)

Instead of trying to ignore the light or remove the light, we are called to run to the light and let go of the darkness. In the end, the light always wins.
