COMING SOON: SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

In 2019, Pope Francis established the Sunday of the Word of God to be celebrated each year on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time. As the Holy Father stated in his apostolic letter instituting the observance, "Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world" (Aperuit illus, no. 2).

On January 21, in observance of the Sunday of the Word of God, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, through a grant from the American Bible Society, will offer a "Sunday Seminar Series" of four videos about Sacred Scripture in the life of the Church. These videos, available in English and Spanish, will feature some of the bishops and biblical scholars and will be accompanied by discussion/reflection questions. The videos will be made available on January 19 at www.catholic.bible/sunday-of-the-word-of-god. Through these videos, we hope to bring people into an encounter with Scripture. May God's people be inspired and challenged to see, understand, and engage with Scripture in a new and prayerful way.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

TONY'S REFLECTION WHAT DO YOU SEEK?

Jesus' first interaction with mankind in the Gospel of John was to ask a question. Jesus saw two guys following Him. He turned to them and asked, "What do you seek?" Why does John place this as the very first question in the Gospel? Is it because this is the first question that Christ requires us to address?

This question from Jesus guides us to come to a profound awareness of ourselves and to understand our desires, to know who we are and who we are to become, for our meaning begins to emerge as we come into an awareness of what we most deeply crave.

The question probes for an underlying and comprehensive longing, "What is drawing me; what do I want?" Another way of phrasing this question is: "What do you want out of life?" "What brings me a sense of meaning and habitual joy?" Of course, the answer to this question is contained in the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. He is asking them the question while being the only one to hold the answer.

The question of Jesus attempts to bring to the surface the desires that are governing human life. It reaches into hope for the joy that gives everything human beings touch expectation and meaning. This question is posed to us. What are you seeking? What drives you? Are you merely seeking comfort, pleasure, admiration, and a cozy life?

The question assumes one is pursuing something, not merely wandering through life like a nomad, or being tossed around like a leaf blowing in every direction the winds of the world take him. A person at a certain time needs to ask: "Where am I going in life?" "What am I looking for?" In our noise-infested world, we forget to search out these pressing questions. We can suppress these questions with our busyness, but these questions are always there. They never go away. It is almost like we are put on this planet to find the answers to these questions. We think the world will offer the answers to our deepest desires, but it becomes a false consolation.

The person who is seeking is in pursuit of something more - the truth. Are we humbly willing to go where the truth is? As Proverbs says, "It is the glory of kings to search a matter out." (Proverbs 25:2). To be on a quest for something more than your pleasant mode of living is a radical journey where self-denial will reward you with the prize of truth.

From the moment we begin to think, we are searching for something. We are searching for answers, meaning, love, and happiness. We are all on a journey in life. We are all moving somewhere, and time is taking us there. Where are we going? How does the journey end? With all the different paths in life to choose from, what am I really looking for? Everyone at some point in their life will ponder these questions. They rise from our souls no matter how many distractions try to hide these questions. So, what do you seek?
