

ADULT FAITH FORMATION

TONY'S REFLECTION EVEN THE DEMONS KNOW

Audiences tend to be fascinated by the topic of exorcisms. In Hollywood, the exorcist film has become a standard genre. One of the fastest-growing religious podcasts is *The Exorcist Files*, which is based on the real cases of Fr. Carlos Martins. The exorcist phenomenon fascinates audiences partly because it taps into the mysterious realm of the supernatural.

In the creed at Mass, we proclaim that God is "creator of the visible and invisible world." When we state the "invisible world," we refer to the supernatural realm in which angelic beings play a prominent role. In this spiritual domain, angels serve the ranks of God, while fallen angels serve the devil in attempting to ruin God's creation and steal souls along the way. In the Catholic tradition, we adore reason and the sciences, but our faith acknowledges a dimension of reality that goes beyond what the sciences can measure. While we don't have full access to this world, Scripture is clear it exists, and, at times, this invisible world comes breaking through into the visible world.

Throughout the Bible, Jesus performed numerous exorcisms as Scripture reads, "he cast out many demons" (Mark 1: 29-34, see also Matthew 8:16, 8:28-34, Luke 4:41). In the Gospel reading today, a man in the synagogue is taken over by an "unclean spirit" and Jesus removes this dark spirit by simply saying, "Come out of him."

First, it is interesting that the possessed man was present in the synagogue. It shows us that those under the influence of evil spirits may be found even in places of worship. What sticks out is the demon's acknowledgment of Jesus's authority and power over him. When confronted by Jesus, the demon says, "I know who you are - the Holy One of God!" Knowing who Jesus is strikes terror in the demons because He frees people from their tyrannical power. Being entirely given the authority of the Father, the Son invokes His supreme authority by uttering a short phrase the demon's will is forced to follow.

While the human fascination with the exorcism genre invokes our curiosity into the spiritual realm, we can contemplate what this world teaches us about sin and God's power over sin. Dark powers manifest themselves everywhere – in sin, in human dysfunction, and yes, also in rare instances when a demon physically or mentally takes control of a person. But Christ has the authority to swiftly remove it, assuming our faith in Him is secure.

This brief exchange between Jesus and a demon in the Gospel shows us that faith is more than just believing that Jesus is God. Even the demons know this. Faith is your response to the fact that Jesus is God. Faith has you decide what you will do given that Jesus is God – follow Him or not. The demons know Jesus is God, yet they view Him as a threat – which is why they tremble before Him. Those who worship Christ and love Him have a great advocate anytime these dark powers attempt to lure them away.
