

TONY'S REFLECTION AM I A LEPER?

Leprosy was a skin disease that defiled its victims, causing them to be unfit to participate in worshiping God (Lev. 13: 1-8). People stayed away from lepers in the ancient world, much like people halted from interacting with COVID patients in 2020. Ritual uncleanness was considered highly contagious in the O.T., infecting everyone who came in contact with it. Consequently, lepers were isolated from society to keep those who were clean separated from those who were unclean (Lev. 13: 45-46).

While reading the law in Leviticus might be challenging, it helps to grasp that the entire book of Leviticus is ordered to correct the problem that arose in Exodus. Exodus was about getting God's people out of sinful, desolate Egypt to worship God at Mt. Sinai. However, when Israel worshiped the Egyptian idol, Leviticus served as a rule book of remedy to get Egypt out of Israel's heart. But, getting Egypt out of Israel served as a messy ordeal, full of examining the diseases that flowed from Israel's idolatry.

In Catholic theology, the spiritual and physical worlds have a corresponding interplay between them in which the rupture in the spiritual world has bleed-over effects into the physical world. As Father Hezekias sums up, "There is a connection between sin of the soul and sickness of the body." While this doesn't mean there is a direct personal correlation (e.g., I'm sick, therefore, I must have just committed a mortal sin), it rather shows that, with the advent of original sin, the human creation now finds itself living in a fallen world of disease and death. Here, sickness of the body, in general, acts as a byproduct of sin. When Jesus rebuked the Pharisees (Matthew 23:25-26), He noted how they failed to make the connection that cleansing the inside (soul) affects the cleanliness of the outside (body). Because cleanliness in the soul is manifested poetically as purity in the body (Psalm 24:4), when Jesus heals the physical disease of leprosy, the deeper meaning is that the leper's soul is pure and ready to now participate in the holy worship of God.

While having a person shout he's "unclean" is contrary to our modern ears, it is crucial to realize the 0.T. covers the physical effects of sin, while the N.T. displays the spiritual components of sin. Therefore, when the penitent waits in the confessional line outside the sanctuary, he would be analogous to the person in the 0.T. communicating he's "unclean." The same situation in Leviticus happens when we show ourselves to the priest in the Sacrament of Penance. On our knees like the leper, we confess our sins to the Lord, and through the outstretched arm and divine word spoken by His priest, the Lord takes away the quilt of our sin.

Jesus wasn't frightened by touching the leper, just as He isn't deterred by our sins in the confessional — as both can't negatively affect His purity. So, we don't need to be in a grumpy demeanor being in the state of a "leper." Here, we can display the humility and courage of the leper to go to Christ in the confessional and be made clean.
