

TONY'S REFLECTION INTO THE DESERT

As we enter the First Sunday of Lent, our readings give us two prominent themes worth exploring. Those themes are the desert and forty days.

Forty days for the Jewish people is the traditional number of days of discipline and preparation for renewal. It rained for forty days during the great flood. Moses stayed on the mountain of God for forty days. The Israelite spies went into the land of the giants for forty days to do a reconnaissance mission. Elijah traveled for forty days before he reached the cave, where he had a vision of God. Jonah went to Nineveh to preach for forty days. Jewish people viewed a forty-day period as a time of penance and self-examination, where you enter into a desert life to get closer to God. Forty days also hold a significant meaning regarding being situated as ten percent. While not an exact number, forty days is close to a tenth of the year. In this way, forty days represent a way to tithe a percentage of the year to God.

What is the significance of deserts? Deserts are places ill-suited for humans to live, given their extreme geographical features. Our deserts can be literal or metaphorical, but in the Bible, we learn they can be the very places where God finds us and calls us back to life in Him.

Deserts serve as a dualistic symbol of a place of warning and also as the locale of spiritual encounters. The desert can be a sign of punishment (Psalm 68:7). It can be a symbol of the result of neglectful leadership (Jeremiah 12:10-11) as well as a warning sign of divine judgment (Isaiah 32:11-16). Deserts can also invite deep reflection on spiritual realities. In Deuteronomy 32:10, God found his people in the desert and shielded them from the harsh elements. Centuries later, when the people of Judah are driven into exile in Babylon, God calls on them to return to their homeland, and the desert that separates them from Jerusalem is now to be understood as a pathway back to their God.

In the New Testament, the Judean desert becomes a place for a significant encounter between the people and the prophet John the Baptist. After Jesus' temptation in the desert, it became a place of renewal as angels came to minister to Him there.

The deserts of our lives are undoubtedly troubling places of temptation and doubt, but they can also be the occasion for profound spiritual renewal. Because what happens when life goes into the desert? The desert is a place where life dies. The meaning behind this for ardent sinners, as we are, is to allow those attachments that hold us back from God to die. When we go into "desert living" this Lent, we let die our need for comfort and pleasure. Desert life forges a climate of spiritual rebirth where our impediments to God are purged.

As the lushness of our comfortable world is stripped from our senses by the barrenness of a desert, our spiritual life will flourish as we turn our hearts toward God and discover what is truly important in our lives.
