NEW SOUND SYSTEM IN THE CHURCH

You told us you couldn't hear us. We listened, and we heard you. Soon, you'll be able to hear us loudly and clearly.

As we prepared for the diocesan *Legacy of Faith, Hope & Love* capital campaign in 2021, our pastor, staff, board members and campaign volunteers identified potential enhancements we could make around campus using our parish's share of the funds from the campaign. One glaring area of need was the sound system in the church.

Our church is beautiful, timeless, structurally sound, and filled with holiness. But the acoustics have long been an issue. For years, parishioners and guests alike have struggled to hear clearly in our worship area. Dated technology and a lack of acoustical infrastructure caused sound to bounce around the walls, making it difficult to hear.

Thanks to your generous support of the *Legacy* campaign, we are excited to announce that we are able to address these issues. Starting this weekend, we are installing a new sound system. This state-of-the-art system promises to enrich our worship experience, ensuring clarity and resonance in every prayer, hymn, and homily. With clearer sound quality and improved acoustics, we aim to elevate our liturgies and deepen our connection with the Divine Word.

We have hired Griggs Audio Productions in Franklin to install the system. Engineers will be on campus throughout the week. Barring any setbacks, the new system will be up and running by our 5 p.m. Vigil Mass on Saturday, March 2. This will not affect our daily Mass schedule throughout the week, but please note there will be limited sound capabilities at these liturgies and we will not be able to livestream the Masses this week.

We would like to thank the gifted advisers working on this project for their diligence and expertise. We would also like to thank everyone who participated in the Legacy campaign. Without your generous support, the funding of this project would not be possible.

TONY'S REFLECTION HOW MUCH DO YOU TRUST GOD?

Trust is the glue that solidifies any relationship. In our readings today, Abraham and the disciples are tested to see how much they trust the Lord. A bit of backstory with Abraham shows his trust in God comes and goes. In Genesis, God calls Abraham out from Haran to the land of Canaan. In uprooting his family and his way of life to a new place, Abraham clearly trusts God. Later, God made a covenant with Abraham and promised him that from his family line would burst descendants as abundant as the stars. As God told Abraham this, He had him look up at the sky to count the stars. Interestingly, we learn that the sun was still out (Gen. 15:12) when God was "showing" Abraham the numerous stars of his descendants. This means Abraham couldn't see it but had to trust God that those stars were there. Did Abraham trust God's plan? Not really, because while his wife, Sarah, was barren, Abraham planned to have children through another woman – Hagar. So, instead of trusting in God's plan of descendants, he couldn't see, he concocted his own plan. This turned out to backfire against Abraham as he had to banish Hagar and the child, Ishmael, from his land.

While Abraham's trust wavered, God gave Abraham another chance to trust Him. In Genesis 22, God asks Abraham and his son of the promise, Isaac, if they are willing to participate in the kind of self-sacrificial love that the Holy Trinity will have to demonstrate to save mankind. Abraham and Isaac respond by their actions. We might think this test of trust to kill his son is too extreme. According to St. Ephrem, Abraham and Isaac's level of trust increased so much that they believed that God would resurrect Isaac from the dead. Before heading up the mountain, Abraham told his servants, "Stay here with the donkey, while the boy and I go on over there. We will worship and then come back to you" (Genesis 22:5). St. Ephrem comments that this verse implies that Abraham and Isaac believed in the resurrection – and both would return after this act of worship.

Here, we come to the Transfiguration of Jesus atop a mountain. Jesus became so glaringly white that the disciples became "exceedingly afraid." As the disciples experienced a holy shock from the Transfiguration, the Father declared, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." In this way, the Father tells the disciples to trust Christ, for what He is about to reveal to them is hard to "see." As they descended the mountain, Christ told the disciples that He would rise from the dead.

The story of Abraham and Isaac's faith mirrors what Jesus calls His disciples in the Transfiguration. Both are given a jarring glimpse of that which they can't comprehend. While they were perplexed about God's plan, eventually, both came to trust God completely. The only way to increase our faith is to entrust ourselves totally to the Lord, who can see what we cannot see on our own.
