


# A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JUSTIN RAINES: COVERING IMAGES DURING THE FIFTH WEEK OF LENT

During Lent, we are accustomed to giving up things. You may have noticed we give up some things at Mass, too. Since Ash Wednesday, we have given up singing the Gloria ("Glory to God in the highest...") and Alleluia. During the last days before Easter, we also give up looking at the images in the church. The images have to be covered on Holy Thursday and Good Friday, but the older tradition is to have them covered the last two weeks of Lent. The Roman Missal says, "In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from [the Fifth Sunday of Lent] may be observed." Exercising this option allows more people to participate in this tradition, people who may not be able to come on Holy Thursday and Good Friday. Covering the images helps us to practice a kind of fasting of the eyes, and it calls us to listen more attentively to the Scriptures, especially the Gospels of the Passion, which we read on Palm Sunday and Good Friday. It also invites us to renew our commitment to observing Lent, at a time when our commitment may be waning, in preparation for the joy of Easter.

#### TONY'S REFLECTION

#### THE HOUR HAS COME

Viewing a church from the outside, the stained glass windows don't look like much other than multicolored glass. However, when you walk inside the church, the stained glass windows pulsate with sacred scenes that enhance our prayer and mental immersion into the faith.

Seeing things from the inside rather than the outside tends to illuminate our understanding of that thing — especially as it pertains to spiritual matters. In today's Gospel reading, Jesus announces, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." When Jesus says "the hour" has come, let us try to place ourselves "inside" the message to grasp what Jesus is telling us. In John's Gospel, Jesus directly refers to "the hour" six times, while John refers to "the hour" in three other areas (7:30, 8:20, 13:1).

If we add up the instances when Jesus refers to "the hour," we can compile a composite of His message. His first three references to "the hour" tell us that the hour will come in the future. First, we see that in His hour, He will provide wine (John 2:4). Second, in His hour, He will provide a new way of worship that will include all people (John 4:21,23). Third, in His hour, He will give the Word of God made flesh so that those who are spiritually dead will have divine life in them (John 5:25). Here, we come to a decisive turning point where He tells us that "the hour has come" (John 12:23). But, what was it in this scene that provoked the arrival of Jesus' hour? We are at the Passover celebration in Jerusalem, and a group of Greeks are interested in seeing Jesus. Rather than Jesus responding by carving out some time to meet with the Greeks, Jesus launches into a bigpicture overview of His mission. This scene tells us that Jesus' message is no longer solely contained within the boundaries of Israel. Now that Jesus' interest has reached the polytheistic worshipers, His mission is coming to a crescendo, and His glorification is at hand.


But how will the Son of Man be glorified? In a rather peculiar fashion — by dying similarly to how a grain of wheat goes into the ground to give new life. The whole point of a single grain being put into the ground is that it will grow and form more grains, leading to the fruit of bread. Therefore, Jesus expects to be glorified by dying to provide spiritual food analogous to a single grain of wheat providing bread. Therefore, if we add "the hour" phrases, we see that Jesus will provide us bread and wine in His hour, a new way of worship for all people that will bring us from darkness to light.

Those on the outside looking in might merely view Jesus' "hour" as the time when He is unfairly arrested and executed (John 7:30, 8:20). But, looking on the inside, Jesus shows us that the authorities weren't taking His life. Still, He was freely giving up His earthly life solely to produce fruit for us — to implant His divine life into us.

#### **REGISTER FOR SCUBA VBS**


