


STATIONS OF THE CROSS FOR THE UNBORN - TUESDAY, MARCH 26

TONY'S REFLECTION LOVE IN SUFFERING

Holy Week is not for the faint of heart. Today's events in the Gospel oblige us to see the treachery of sin up close. Jesus took on Himself all the gruesome effects of sin in the Passion even though He had no sin. It's one thing to hear the phrase "the wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23), but it's another thing to have the horrid effects of sin put before your eyes to see. If you've watched the movie, "The Passion of Christ," you've seen the dramatic impact of our sins portrayed in graphic scenes of Christ's severe torture.

Other images come to mind. You've probably heard of the Shroud of Turin — a linen with an image of a crucified man believed to be the burial cloth of Jesus. To be sure, the debate around the Shroud of Turin still rages - and will most likely continue to go on despite the mountain of evidence favoring its claim as the burial cloth of Jesus. Pope John Paul II called the shroud the greatest relic in Christendom. Within the shroud, we get a glimpse of Jesus's suffering for us. Scientists have determined that the man in the shroud received one hundred twenty heavy lacerations in his body with fifteen puncture wounds on his skull (likely from the crown of thorns). While being crucified, a large nail went through the bottom of both the man's hands, severing his median nerve, which, in turn, sent intense bolts of pain down his arms.

What perhaps speaks to us directly in this image is the serenity of the man's face on the shroud. Obviously, forensic analysis tells us that this man has been gravely tortured. He was scourged with piercing metal, had sharp thorns penetrate his head, was severely beaten on the face, and nails through the bottom of the hands and feet. While this man endured agonizing punishment, his face displays peacefulness and serenity. This calm disposition is radically different from other images in history where someone died a violent death.

While witnessing these images is emotionally draining, they help us understand how damaging our sins all the while prominently showcasing Christ's love for us. That fact that He knowingly and willingly went through this torturous experience all to win us back gives us insight into the strength of His love.


I have to face the harsh reality that my sins helped nail Jesus to the cross. All of our guilty stains are what led Jesus to that blood-stained cross, where He openly absorbed all of our sins. The taunts and torments we hear in these readings punctuate the Gospel as Jesus is beaten and mocked, as His hands and feet are pierced, as enemies gamble for His clothes, and as three times they dare Him to prove His divinity by saving Himself from suffering.

Yet, despite all the gloom and doom we witness in Christ's suffering, we also witness His immense love for us. For every physical and mental wound He received, He is telling us it is all worth it to save us.



- Spend five minutes in silence every day
- Go to Confession
- Attend the Triduum liturgies at Saint Matthew
- Read through the different Gospel stories of the Last Supper
- Go on a local pilgrimage to different Catholic churches in Nashville
- Spend time in Adoration at the altar of repose
- Keep watch with Jesus on Thursday night by giving up music or TV
- Pray the Stations of the Cross
- Wear black to the Passion of the Lord
- Remain silent and somber from noon til 3 p.m. on Good Friday
- Pray morning prayer or read the Bible on Holy Saturday
- Spend time reflecting on your Lenten Season

Did you know...

Saint Matthew School students and their families raise \$12,600 per year to help pay for the salaries of the principal and teachers at Our Lady of Miracles (OLOM) School in Gobert, Haiti?

Every year, Saint Matthew School conducts a Penny Drive during Catholic Schools Week to help cover these costs. This year's drive collected a record \$5,500! Our 7th grade class chose this campaign as their annual service project. Each student developed a slide with information on our sister parish and school, ranging from information for the Penny Drive to Haiti facts to raise awareness for this great cause.
