


BECOME AN EMHC

TONY'S REFLECTION

RECOGNIZING JESUS

The old TV crime show "Colombo" featured an experienced detective named Colombo who would often cloak his character as he would unassumingly socialize with different "persons of interest," asking disarmingly simple and even naïve questions to get them to open up. Similarly, in the Gospel scene today, we find a hidden Jesus nonchalantly strolling along two disciples, acting like He's not privy to the dramatic news of Easter Sunday.

Unbeknownst to themselves, these disciples tell Jesus all about their expectations of Him. The discouraged travelers had hoped that Jesus would reign as king in Jerusalem and rescue Israel from Roman oppression. Yet their hopes are out of step with God's plan to rescue them from sin and death rather than political subjection. As is typically the case, our will is far different and inferior to God's will. Later, the disciples will realize that release from spiritual tyranny is far greater than temporary physical oppression.

In their grief, these disciples wrestle aloud with their shattered hopes in Jesus of Nazareth, the Messiah. Ironically, they do this unknowingly with the very person they were mourning. Here, as Jesus patiently proceeds through the Old Testament, explaining the key passages prophesying His nature and ministry, Jesus begins to reveal that He is, in fact, the Messiah. Talk about participating in the ultimate Bible study led directly by Jesus.

Enthralled by this in-depth exposition of all the Scriptures, they pleaded to this mysterious man to stay with them as they stopped at the Emmaus village. He agreed, and at the evening meal, He "took, blessed, broke, and gave" the bread to those present. Here, Luke employs this same sequence of four verbs in his account of the feeding of the 5,000 and at the Last Supper. This helps us to understand the significance of their "recognition" of Jesus.

It's vital to grasp that at the beginning of this encounter, Scripture indicates that the disciples' "eyes were kept from recognizing him." And then, after Jesus "took," "blessed," "broke," and "gave" them this holy, consecrated bread, their "eyes were open, and they recognized him, and he vanished out of their sight."


So, they recognized Him for a second, then He vanished. Where did He go? Jesus didn't merely disappear into thin air. Instead, He is now physically present in the bread He just took, blessed, broke, and gave. This serves as a holy lesson for us—we should "recognize" Jesus in the broken bread. Therefore, there is no need to seek an obscure apparition of Jesus because He is truly present with us in the Eucharistic host.

The structure of the Emmaus episode eloquently reflects the structure of the Mass. First, open up the Scriptures (the Liturgy of the Word and homily), then pray over bread and present this holy Eucharistic bread to the people. We might miss this concept, just like those disciples walking with Jesus initially didn't get it. When we abandon our way of thinking and allow God's message to saturate us, our "eyes will be open," just like those disciples' eyes were opened.

REGISTER FOR SCUBA VBS



Through education, medical care, and clean water and power, we are trying to live up to the Haiti Ministry's mission statement: *The Haiti Committee of Saint Matthew Catholic Church exists to support, nurture, and educate the people of our sister parish in Gobert, Haiti.*
