

HAITI SPRING OF HOPE APPEAL




SAINT MATTHEW HAITI MINISTRY 2024 APPEAL





TONY'S REFLECTION

HOW TO RECOGNIZE THE GOOD SHEPHERD

Today is typically referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday in the liturgical schedule. While we can rightly assume that the underlying theme of our Gospel is that Jesus is the Good Shepherd and we represent the sheep, other facets are at play here that can help illuminate God's message to us. According to biologists, sheep are one of the first animals to be domesticated. Therefore, they are typically gentile and docile animals – open to training and being led by someone else (i.e., a shepherd) while unable to survive on their own. However, given their submissive manner towards others, they can become susceptible to being manipulated by a devious guide. Therefore, as humble animals willingly to be directed by others sheep need to be cautious about understanding if their shepherd is leading them in the right direction.

An honest assessment of the Biblical landscape is that most shepherds have failed to truly care for and lead God's sheep. John's Gospel passage is a clear reference to the Old Testament prophecy of Ezekiel. In the Ezekial parable (Ezk. 34:1-24), the sheep represent the people of Israel, and the shepherds signify the corrupt rulers of Israel. What Ezekial is getting at is the O.T. shepherds have been pasturing themselves rather than their sheep. Instead of sacrificing themselves for their sheep, they've been brutally lording over their sheep. This caused the sheep to become scattered, alone, and vulnerable to outside prey. Therefore, in a bizarre switch, the shepherds become akin to the wolves that end up feeding on their own sheep (Eziekel 34:10).

The Ezeiekel prophecy ends with God promising that He will come after these selfish shepherds while, at the same time, the Lord will become the true Good Shepherd who will sacrifice Himself for His sheep. The Ezeikel prophecy is a bit of a cliffhanger for the sheep – a promise that keeps them waiting in suspense for this good Shepherd, all the while having false shepherds lurk in the background.

In the Gospel, Jesus speaks of a "hireling." The hireling is a pretender shepherd who cares more about himself than his sheep. As Theophilus of Antioch writes, "The hireling does not know his sheep because he sees them so little." The hireling does not say, "This is my body that is given up for you." The hirelings flee their followers the second the wolf strolls in.

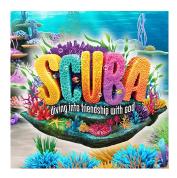
As unassuming sheep, we are duped by aspiring shepherds masquerading around as good shepherds. In this world, there exists a cacophony of competing messages coming from many authoritative voices in the world (i.e., false shepherds).

The crucial question remains - how do we distinguish the Good Shepherd from the hirelings of our world? The answer simply is by spending time with Him. The more time we devote to prayer, Scripture, Adoration, and the Mass, the more Jesus's teaching, His utterances, and His voice will become ingrained in us. If we consume Our Lord into us intimately and reverently in the Eucharist, His inner being, which contains His voice, will continue to reverberate in us like a sacred echo guiding us to Him.


