

TONY'S REFLECTION

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

If someone announced, "I have good news and bad news," we generally would insist on hearing the bad news first, followed by the good news. After all, the dire news is better absorbed when we know it's followed by more pleasant news. In our faith, there exists both persistent bad news with the state of human sin, the existence of evil, and the collective yawn of indifference to God from society. However, the bad news is followed by the incredible good news of Jesus' work and the graces that flow from Him and His Church that usher us into eternal life with the Holy Trinity. The faith oscillates between two poles of which man must keenly be aware. During Lent, we experienced the more unpleasant news of sacrifice, suffering, and the sadness of knowing that our sins violently crucified Christ. Now, in the Easter season, we have transitioned to the more invigorating news. The tomb is empty. Our sins are forgiven, and we are redeemed. This Sunday, the good news keeps rolling - we celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy Sunday.

Pope John Paul II established this feast day in 2000 when he canonized Sister Faustina Kowalska. St. Faustina Kowalska was a nun who, in the 1930s, received a series of private revelations from Jesus, who communicated that His mercy is His greatest attribute. She recorded those experiences in her diary.

In the case of the Feast of Divine Mercy, our Lord promises that "On this day, the very depths of my tender mercy are open. I pour a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of my mercy. The soul that will go to confession, and receive Holy Communion, shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.... Let no soul fear to draw near to me, even though its sins be as scarlet" (Diary, # 699). Here, Jesus announces that His mercy is available to all who ask for it. The one caveat for us is that we must actively ask for His mercy.

To ask for God's mercy, one needs to be in the state of repentance. The divine formula of repentance followed by mercy is articulated throughout the Gospels, "that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be preached in his name" (Luke 24:47). Therefore, God forgives sins only if we repent of them. Obviously, we need to grasp the state of our wretchedness; otherwise, what's the point of asking for mercy if we don't think we need it? Ironically, witnessing our misery acts as a conveyor belt to receiving Christ's abundant mercy. The father of the prodigal son allowed his son to wallow with the pigs so that he could recognize his sins – which ultimately led him back into his father's arms. To thwart God's mercy, the devil tempts us with pride. Such is the line of pride: "I don't need to ask for mercy. God's the one who needs to apologize to me." Whereas pride impedes requesting forgiveness, humility acts as an instrument in which we seek forgiveness with all our strength.

Here lies the good news - Jesus wants to pardon us and renew us completely. The pressing question we need to ask: Will we allow Him to do this?




From 2004 to 2019, a team of medical team of doctors, nurses, dentists, and others went to Our Lady of Miracles (OLOM) annually. Due to violence, gangs, and political instability, we have been unable to travel to Gobert since January 2019. In these previous medical missions, the team saw an average of 2,500 patients per week to treat a variety of medicial issues.

In 2010, OLOM hired Dr. Previlus Librice, the staff physician, to run its medical clinic. Dr. Librice is an invaluable asset to the OLOM community because access to medical treatment in the area is limited. Dr. Librice sees patients to treat tropical diseases such as malaria, intestinal parasites and typhoid, and manage chronic conditions like hypertension and diabetes. He also dispenses medications and vaccines for the children and educates the community about clean water and sanitation.

Through the funds raised from Well Played: A Songwriters Night and generous donations from the Saint Matthew community, we can continue to provide medications and pay Dr. Librice's salary each year. We cannot wait to return to Haiti one day for on-site medical missions. For now, we will continue to support Dr. Librice and all his endeavors from afar.
