

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY









TONY'S REFLECTION

DEATH IS NOW DEAD

Today, a great victory is announced. Good triumphs over evil. Yet with a quick glance at John's reading, one might be perplexed at the absence of such a jubilant decree. After all, there is no dramatic appearance of the risen Jesus, nor any grand proclamation by angels that death has been defeated. The final verse even states that the disciples "did not yet understand the Scripture that He had to rise from the dead." Given such an extraordinary event, why aren't there more fireworks in the narrative? While it might seem that Scripture is not speaking in grandiose terms on the surface, much is packed into this scene.

At first, we hear confusion from Mary Magdalene and the disciples. Notice how John described that Mary "came to the tomb early, while it was still dark." Church Fathers have taught John's description of it being "dark" out poetically reflects the belief of Jesus's followers - darkened and not entirely in the light (i.e., the truth). However, as the daylight spread, they began to comprehend and believe, and finally, they saw the dawning of a new creation. This theme underscores one's spiritual life. At first, a person mired in sin is in darkness and doesn't grasp profound spiritual truths. As one gets a glimpse of the light's surface, the transition from dark to light provokes confusion in trying to put deep spiritual insights together. If you've been consuming worldly messages for much of your life, reading Scripture becomes confusing initially as it might not make sense. But truth and belief take over as the light of "the day" progresses.

Notice also the repetition of the word "tomb"—seven times in nine verses. Here, the tomb represents the sleeping chamber of death. As Thomas Aquinas remarks, "Death is called sleep because of the hope of the resurrection, and so it has been customary to give death this name..."


Besides viewing the tomb as an allegorical window into sleep, by focusing on the burial cloth, St. John also illuminates that the burial cloth signifies a sleeping garment. The recognition of the burial cloths reveals that Jesus hadn't been merely carted off by grave robbers, who usually stole the expensive burial linens and left the corpse behind. By going into the minutiae of the empty tomb description, St. John tells us that something miraculous is afoot. Jesus has casually put aside the fabrics of death's sleep, folding them up like old pajamas, and has left the sleeping chamber for good. We are left with a penetrating reality that, out of the fragments of dying, Christ's tomb is not the dark end but a light-filled beginning. This means that in our own lives, we don't have to live as though death is our master. In light of the Resurrection, we can begin to see earthly life as a gestation place toward something higher, more permanent, and more splendid.

The climax of the Christian faith reaches its crescendo today. In the Easter message, Jesus shows us the ironic paradox of how death is now dead.



Only a short time ago, Our Lady of Miracles (OLOM) had no access to fresh water and no electricity. Through the generous donations from Saint Matthew parishioners, we have been able to provide a well, a water purification system, solar panels and inverters for electricity, a dieselpowered generator to run larger items like the well pump, and countless bio-sand and Sawyer cartridge water filters to the surrounding community.

The critical importance of these items can not be overstated as they provide the most important factor in human health: clean water. We are currently in the process of installing a new osmosis water treatment system which will offer clean water not only to the parish and school, but also the surrounding village. In addition to the water and electrical systems, we have been able to help OLOM expand the school and medical clinic, build a bakery/kitchen and numerous other projects.

All these projects have had returns well beyond the investments provided. The people of Gobert and the committee thank you for your continued support of the Haiti Ministry through our Well *Played: A Songwriters Night* and general donations.
