

TONY'S REFLECTION

RETURN OF THE MASTER

In our house, our oldest son is showing gradual signs of maturity. Given this, we are giving him more responsibility – such as being in charge when my wife and I go out for dinner. By handing on my authority and duty to him, I have temporarily given my oldest child "the keys to the Jesse household." However, I, as master of the household, will return at some point in the night – and hopefully find that my oldest kept everything in order and everyone's behavior was on par with what I taught them.

In today's Gospel, Jesus provides us with a parable where the master departs for a wedding feast and puts his servants in charge. The first aspect of the parable is that the servants don't know when the master will return. This unknown arrival of the master reveals the state of the servant's loyalty toward the master. Are the servants prepared for the master's return? Are they on watch, eagerly awaiting the return of their beloved master, or are the servants running amok precisely because the master is gone? The faithful servants are under the tutelage of the master; thus, they act in the style of the master whether or not there is a security camera recording them. Their belief in the message continues to make the reign of God visible, even though the master has not returned. In contrast, unfaithful servants are under the direction of the world, viewing the master's teaching as a nuisance. The unfaithful servants create a tragic situation in which they abandon the master's teaching. Here, they run rampant in sin and become reminiscent of mischievous children that misbehave as soon as the parents leave the house.

It's intriguing that Jesus gives four different outcomes for four different types of servants. The first servant does what his master wills him to do and is ready for the master's return. The second servant realizes the master is delayed and then begins to cause harm, all the while indulging in his sensual appetites. Here, he gets caught off guard when the master returns, resulting in a terminal separation from the master. Therefore, the first servant signifies the saints in heaven, while the second servant embodies the souls cut off in hell. The third and fourth servants give us a window into the Catholic doctrine of purgatory. While our modern ears might revolt when we hear the word "beaten" or "punished," these words denote that the servants go through a correction period that is temporarily uncomfortable (i.e. purgatory). The third servant knew his master's will but didn't act according to the master's will. He loved his master, yet his actions fell well short of his master's will. The severe nature of his punishment insinuates his time in purgatory, in which his soul is purified to that of his master's, was lengthy. However, the fourth servant didn't know his master's will; thus, his time during this correction phase is shorter and lighter (e.g. the state of a child).

The last line of this parable invokes that famous line from the Spider-Man movie, "With great power comes great responsibility." Jesus assures us, "To whom much is given, much will be required of him." As we love God more, let us take on more responsibility and live out His kingdom so we are ready for His return.
