
Following the **11 a.m. Mass**, a free luncheon will be served in the Cohan-Hansom Building. Please RSVP for the luncheon to ensure enough food.


BAAM UPDATE: HALFWAY THERE!

TONY'S REFLECTION

ARE YOU STRONG ENOUGH

This Sunday we are presented with another challenging lesson from Jesus. Jesus insists that many will attempt to enter the door to His kingdom but will not be strong enough. Why are they not strong enough? Well, one reason is they lack self-discipline. In the second reading, the author of Hebrews articulates that God disciplines those that He loves. But Hebrews also stresses that discipline must come from the self (i.e., self-discipline). Discipline means the ability to forgo immediate pleasures for a greater purpose. In discipline, one learns to temper his flawed desires while at the same time putting in the arduous work needed to fulfill his purpose. In short, discipline is the art of self-mastery. Those who achieve any success, be it an athlete, musician, or entrepreneur know that the skill of discipline is a key ingredient to their success.

With self-mastery, one must constrain what takes him away from his purpose. Ample research in psychology finds a strong connection between higher levels of self-control and life satisfaction. Why are people that are disciplined happier? Because they stand in control of their frivolous feelings rather than being controlled by them.

The disciplined person stands out, full of purpose and meaning. The saints all had discipline, and they were attractive to watch in action. Let us also notice that the word "discipline" is closely connected to the Biblical word "disciple." As Jesus stated, "In the same way, those of you who do not give up everything you have cannot be my disciples" (Luke 14:33). Therefore, discipline is a prerequisite to the Christian faith.

If we put our readings together, we learn those lacking discipline won't be strong enough to enter Christ's narrow path. Refusing discipline to enter the narrow gate, they will attempt to gain entry by claiming they know the master. They exclaim, "Lord, let us in." Here, Jesus bluntly says, "I do not know where you are from." They respond, "We ate and drank in your presence." But, Jesus repeats, "I do not know where you are from." St. Augustine reasoned that this passage that refers to eating and drinking in Jesus's presence can be associated with consuming Him in the Eucharist. Do not think that just because you received the Eucharist your entrance into the narrow gate is guaranteed. As St. Paul declared, "Whoever eats unworthily of the bread and drinks from the Lord's cup makes himself guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord" (1 Cor 11:27).

After their failed attempt, the master announces that these pretenders must depart from His gate and be cast out where they will experience a "wailing and grinding of teeth." Here, Jesus is illuminating the sad reality of hell in which a person chooses to remain opposed to God. Refusing to accept Jesus's narrow way, the unrepentant sinner prefers his way. It's been said that the anthem of hell is, "I did it my way."

The entrance into the master's gate does not come merely because you were in the master's presence, but through doing the master's will (Mt. 7:21). And to do the master's will, you need to cultivate the virtue of self-discipline.
