





WOMEN'S CLUB SOCIAL THIS THURSDAY





TONY'S REFLECTION

THE HOLY CROSS

In a study rating human action to emotional response, psychologists showed people many different images that ranged in the spectrum of human life. As you might guess, images of a Nazi concentration camp received less attention and "likes" by people than other images of human activity. At the core, suffering disrupts our innate desire for survival and well-being. The obvious conclusion from this study is that images that invoke torture are hard to look at. No one seeks these types of images out to be ingrained in their psyche. Yet, as evident as this study is, today we are called to honor the image that would appear as an instrument of torture—the cross of Jesus.

In the readings today we hear two references of lifting an image that would normally summon disgust but, instead, has healing power. In our first reading, Moses hoists a bronze serpent on a pole as a remedy for the faithless people of Israel. The people's lack of faith and love in God led to them being swarmed by poisonous serpents. However, God promised to save everyone who looked at the bronze serpent that Moses raised up. Looking up to the bronze serpent represents the moment when the people realize their deadly betrayal of God and are searching for His mercy. Interestingly, Jesus uses this Old Testament scene to apply it to His own crucifixion and the subsequent healing it will bring to a rebellious world. The lifting up of the serpent signifies the death of Christ. The serpent's poisonous bite is sin, and its effect is death. At the cross Jesus took on the effect we should have received. However, our Lord did not transfer the poisonous sin of the serpent to His flesh, but instead transferred to us His divine life. The effect of our sin is a separation from God, which the cross vividly displays as a sad separation into death. But, ironically, the healing of our sins comes from that very instrument of death—the cross. Not that we are Protestants and believe "once saved always saved" from Jesus's cross, rather, that we apply all the cross has to offer—partaking in the sacramental union, self-denial, embracing suffering, humility, and agape love.

As you stare at the massive crucifix in our sanctuary, the cross will communicate to you two vital concepts. The first is what your sin leads to. Sin is more than bad actions; it is a death of God's immortal life in your soul. Sin leads to a gruesome death. The other concept a crucifix will communicate to you is how much God loves you. That is not you on the cross; it is Jesus Christ—true God and true man. As Scott Hahn puts it, "Jesus paid a debt he didn't owe, because we owed a debt we couldn't pay." The cross reveals a love that is self-emptying and self-giving.

Yes, staring at suffering is incredibly challenging, and often we'd like to look away. But the suffering on the cross is unique. The suffering moment of the cross takes human torture and transforms it into divine love. So, look up at the crucifix and let this image be seared into your memory and into the way you live.

Pier Giorgio Frassati: If I Didn't Have Love

Frassati was a handsome, athletic and fun-loving young man from a rich, aristocratic Italian family who turned from a life of privilege to one devoted to working with the poor, suffering and homeless, and was a courageous witness of Christian faith and charity to many others. An avid mountain climber, Frassati exemplified a great love for life, nature and humanity. He was a leader of youth in Italy in Catholic social justice and charitable organizations, and is the patron saint of World Youth Days. He died of the polio virus at 24.
