



Welcome Bishops!






FATHER DAUGHTER DANCE



Proclaiming the Kingdom: The Gospel of Matthew

The audio course "Proclaiming the Kingdom" systematically unpacks the riches of the Gospel of Matthew. Sometimes called "the Gospel of the Kingdom" because of its central theme, Matthew was the most often quoted of the four gospels in the writings of the early Church Fathers. These talks were originally delivered to an audience of priests and deacons on retreat at St. Vincent's Archabbey in Latrobe, Pennsylvania. They are both theologically rich and eminently practical. To get the most out of these presentations by Dr. Scott Hahn, Dr. Brant Pitre, and Dr. John Bergsma, you should read the chapters of Matthew once through before listening to the lectures.



TONY'S REFLECTION


WHO IS SAINT MATTHEW HOLY CROSS

Today we honor our patron saint who rose to prominence by answering Christ's call to follow Him. It is fitting to reflect on who St. Matthew is and what it means to be linked to him as a parish. Matthew was an odd convert, for he was a despised tax collector turned committed disciple of Christ. Tax collectors were seen as collaborators with the occupying Roman authorities. The Roman tax system was set up to allow tax collectors to extort money for themselves. Because of this scheme, many tax collectors, teeming with greed, would ravenously rip off their own people with the help of the Roman army, thus exercising coordinated corruption. In a sense, tax collectors were like modern mafia dons who extort neighborhood small businesses and even families to pay "protection fees" lest an "accident" happen to their businesses or loved ones. For Jesus to call Matthew at his tax post would be as dramatic as Jesus entering into Al Capone's speakeasy and calling him from his criminal ways into holiness. Yet, Jesus desires radical transformation. He comes to call the most notorious sinners to repentance and a life of conversion.

What's just as flabbergasting as Jesus' call to this despised tax collector was Matthew's response in 9:9: "...and Matthew got up and followed Him." It is hard to know the inner workings of Matthew that lead to this dramatic transformation. Matthew likely heard about Jesus, trusted Him, and saw Him as an opportunity to free himself from being ensconced in depravity. What we do know is that Jesus boldly invited Matthew to break from his livelihood, his sinful past, and follow Him on a challenging trail that will eventually ascend him to greatness. And we know that Matthew was ready to respond to this call.

In Caravaggio's painting, The Calling of St. Matthew (right), Caravaggio implanted theologically rich signals into the scene. Jesus enters a dark room with light shining behind him, a sign that he was calling Matthew from darkness into light. In the room a closed window with a perpendicular wooden pane signifies that to open ourselves to the light we must embrace the cross, we need to die to our old ways, something that would be proposed to Matthew. In the image of Jesus pointing to Matthew with His outstretched right index finger, scholars have long noted that Jesus' hand and finger are similar to the hand and finger that Michelangelo gave to God in the Creation of Adam painting. Jesus was giving Matthew, in other words, a chance at a new creation, of having the "spirit of life" breathed into his sinful, dead soul. As Jesus calls Matthew through the rays of light, we notice Matthew's two hands. His left is pointing to himself, to his heart, almost allowing his heart to speak to him that he is ready.

As spiritual brothers and sisters of St. Matthew, we are called to mimic our patron saint's response - to drop our former way and go "all-in" on Christ. Faced with an arduous challenge and amidst great uncertainty, Matthew jumped at Jesus's call to greatness. In a similar vein, we are called with the same invitation from Jesus. His invitation stands. Are we ready? What is our response?


A SPECIAL NIGHT FOR PARENTS AND TEENS: HUMAN LIFE ON OCTOBER 26
