


OKTOBERFEST - SATURDAY, OCTOBER 4


MASS LIVESTREAMING HAS RESUMED

TONY'S REFLECTION

Two Men In Two Directions

In today's Gospel reading, we witness two people that embody two stark paths. On one hand, you have a rich man that "was clothed with purple and fine linen." In the ancient world, this phrase would have cued up images of high living as purple was expensive apparel often associated with kingship or royalty. And on the other hand, we see a poor man covered with sores craving to eat the scraps at the rich man's gate. From this scene, we view a powerful ruler who rather than serves his fellow man, is ensconced on feasting through his sensual pleasures. Consequently, his selfish fixation results in an eternal sentence in which he experiences "a great chasm" fixed between himself and God.

We'll notice in the readings today that God calls Lazarus by name and knows Joseph in his suffering while the leaders and the rich man have no name. God isn't condemning the concept of being rich and powerful in itself, but their refusal to use it for good all the while being hyper-focused on their sensual pleasures. Here, we come to a common theme in that God raises the lowly to the heavenly banquet while the prideful and gluttonous are far removed. It remains ironic as the world is abuzz with the names of the rich and powerful. Yet to God, they remain anonymous if they don't use their status to point to God and serve others while refraining from merely serving themselves. On the other side of the spectrum, the average and poor are anonymous in the pop culture. Few people at Saint Matthew will be nationally known. Yet, God is showing us that even if the world doesn't know who you are, He does. He recognizes your "sores" of suffering and as long as you keep holding on to His teachings, you will eventually be in His presence just like Lazarus.

This story of the rich man and Lazarus portrays what each view inevitably leads to. Turning inward on sensual pleasures separates one from God, whereas those that suffer and seek Divine assistance find God in the end. These paths are realized at the point of death. We'll notice that the rich man, being spiritually blind his whole life, is frantically trying to fix his dilemma. However, the man who has his spiritual affairs in order shows no reason to panic as he approaches death.

The cultural air we breathe trains us to surround ourselves with comfort and luxury yet this inevitably leads to a life of debauchery. We must also take stock that given our culture's fixation on health and longevity, we generally stand frightened by the prospect of death and spend too much of our time and energy evading its inevitable occurrence. Yet the resurrection of Christ cries out to mankind that if we cling to Him who is Life, our death that separates our soul from our body will lead to our soul eventually uniting with Christ. Devout Christians should look forward to the day when they will see the Lord, and prepare for it every day by their way of life, by remaining in the state of grace, and by asking the Lord for the gift of perseverance in His love.




A SPECIAL NIGHT FOR PARENTS AND TEENS: HUMAN LIFE ON OCTOBER 26
