




OLIVE WOOD CARVING SALE - SEPTEMBER 6 & 7


GET YOUR TICKETS NOW!



TONY'S REFLECTION

Not Such A Large Cost

The planet Jupiter is a gas giant that can fit 1,300 Earths in it. Science now shows us that the exact positioning and size of Jupiter allows the earth, and, in turn, us to survive. Due to its massive size, Jupiter's gravity pulls in hazardous debris and volatile compounds from the asteroid belt. It also prevents solar storms from distant stars from affecting us. In short, Jupiter acts like an offensive lineman absorbing the blow of a cosmic blitz to allow planet Earth to have its comfortable setting in the hostile universe. The precise placement and mass of Jupiter is one of many other examples that show how God created the universe with a fine-tuned precision to sustain our life. For example, if the speed of light were to be slightly faster or slower, life on earth would not be possible. If the gravitational constant were to be different, none of us would exist. If the exact tilt of the earth was altered by a hair's breadth, the temperature would not sustain life.

Knowing the great lengths that God goes to create and protect His creation, the cost of becoming Christ's disciple doesn't seem so daunting. Yet, Jesus teaches us that the call to follow Him cannot be taken half-heartedly, as such an attitude is a tragic miscalculation. Like a king getting ready for battle or a contractor about to build a tower, Jesus implores us to prepare and count the cost before we set out to follow Him.

Discipleship is a serious endeavor that involves more than merely testing the waters of faith. Given this commitment, you need to plan and calculate it prior to putting it into action, otherwise despair will ensue. St. Cyril of Alexandria cautioned that the disciple should first work on loving God and understanding His ways before putting in the sacrificial work of being a disciple. As St. Cyril wrote, "How will those who do not have any zeal be able to reach the goal that is set before them?" He reasoned that man could not finish the work of a disciple because he was bound to his former way.

From a purely earthly perspective, the cost of being a disciple of Christ appears too much of an extreme trade. We must give up possessions, even "hate" family relationships, to be a disciple of Christ? The word "hate" is an idiomatic term that refers "to love less." In this sense, Jesus tells us to give up the things that can become an excuse or an obstacle to giving ourselves completely to Him. Here, we are to "hate" our old lives, to detach from all the earthly attachments. Jesus is showing us that discipleship must be accepted with mature deliberation. Yes, the cost seems great. But the Jupiter example allows us to reflect on how God's fatherly care and protection He provides us, even in the intricate details of the way He created the universe, should allow us to go "all in" on Him.

Christ offers what the modern world cannot: structure, sacrifice, and mystery. As Peter Kreeft observes, "Catholicism doesn't whisper that you're perfect just the way you are. It demands transformation. It demands submissionto something older, wiser, and greater than you." Knowing this, the cost doesn't seem that bad.
