



### TONY'S REFLECTION

### HAVE GRATITUDE

Psychologists indicate that 80% of our thoughts are negative, while 95% of our thoughts are recurring. This means that people walk through life with an abundance of anxiety and pessimism. It is no wonder why psychologists are adamant that having a state of gratitude is the hinge to happiness. Dr. Daniel G. Amen, the popular brain researcher, identifies gratitude as a key character quality of a person with physiologically healthy brains. Research in psychology reveals that people who are grateful experience more happiness and contentment. When someone is in a grateful disposition, the chemicals of serotonin, dopamine, and oxytocin are released into their brain, which, in turn, causes anxiety and stress to plummet. Being in the mental state of gratitude also lights up the part of the brain focused on learning and problem-solving. It does this so much that psychologists believe that people who complain tend to have a lower IQ than those who are grateful. Therefore, there is a direct connection between gratitude and a better mental disposition.

In discovering gratitude, people recognize the source of goodness placed in their lives lies outside themselves. This gratitude helps people eliminate a self-centered disposition and connects them to the very entity that created them—God.

While the mental benefits of gratitude are substantial, our readings today focus on the spiritual necessity of gratitude. In the O.T. reading, the prophet Elisha cures the Syrian, Naaman. Elated with gratitude, Naaman disavowed his pagan worship and devoted himself solely to the Lord of Israel. In the Gospel reading, Jesus healed ten lepers, but only one returned to thank Jesus. This Gospel reading goes beyond mere polite etiquette to remember to thank God when He has healed you. This passage leads us to contemplate worship as an expression of gratitude. This concept is especially true of the central act of Catholic worship, the liturgy of the Eucharist, since "eucharist" comes from the Greek word for "thanksgiving."

All the lepers are cleansed, but only one—the Samaritan—returns to thank Jesus. In response to his healing, the Samaritan, "fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him"—this is virtually an act of worship. Therefore, it is crucial to realize in our readings, that foreigners are cured of leprosy and their immediate reaction is gratitude in worship.

St. Thomas Aquinas places gratitude under the virtue of justice. With this, Aquinas asserts that gratitude is actually an obligation you owe to God. Aquinas's theology on gratitude is why we have the exchange in the Eucharistic prayers of the Mass as follows: Priest: "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God." People: "It is right and just." Aquinas goes on to articulate that if you don't have a sense of gratitude from within but rather have an entitled "give me" disposition, it reveals a soul that is under control of the intoxicating grip of pride. By contemplating and offering gratitude toward God, we ascend our stature to a higher level. The Mass is our highest expression of thanks and gratitude for what God has done in our lives. Let us find gratitude at the worship in Mass.
