

#### **WOMEN'S CLUB BOOK CLUB MEETING**





#### TONY'S REFLECTION

#### PERSISTENCE BEATS RESISTANCE

The Grand Canyon is a transverse system of narrow, winding, deep canyons. This immense rock formation was shaped by the Colorado River. The Grand Canyon demonstrates that in the confrontation between the river and the rock, the river always wins—not through strength but by sheer perseverance. The river keeps moving, and through its consistent churning, the river holds great power over the giant rock.

Our readings today highlight the power of persistence in the form of prayer and how ongoing prayer alludes to a great battle. Spiritual warfare is a theological concept in which opposing ideas and cultures clash, illuminating the conflict between good and evil. Our first reading shows a battle between Israel and their mortal foe, the Amalekites. The Amalekites were an ancient expression of the culture of death—nomads who would hunt down the weak and vulnerable. It seemed like a desperate situation for the Israelites. Recently released from slavery, the Israelites were journeying through the wilderness on their way to Mt. Sinai, only to be flanked by a lawless, violent group. Israel has few, if any, weapons and limited military experience. Yet, the narrative shifts from a military strategy to victory through spiritual means as Moses goes to the mountaintop to beseech God in prayer. It is vital to realize that whenever Moses was deep in prayer, Israel prevailed in the battle, but when Moses stopped praying, the Amalekites prevailed. Because of this, Aaron and Hur elevated the hands of Moses, allowing him to pray throughout the day, which, in turn, gave Israel the victory. Here, we grasp that prayer not only requires ongoing diligence, but prayer is also a team effort, invoking how the intercession of saints plays a prominent role.

In the Old Testament, there were no "secular" wars. Every battle was both a physical and spiritual conflict, because the opposing armies always called on their respective gods. This scene portrays the reality that we often find ourselves in a struggle of competing ideas that rise from a spiritual clash. Immersed in spiritual warfare, prayer acts as a resilient weapon in curtailing wicked ideas from entering our souls.

Jesus's parable strikes a similar chord in encouraging persistent prayer. As the vulnerable widow pleaded for justice, so we should persevere in faith, tirelessly petitioning God for our needs in prayer. After all, if an unjust and callous judge will vindicate a persistent widow, God will come to the aid of his prayerful children much more. The moral sense of this text is a good example of the complementarity of how prayer and action are necessary in doing God's work.

We must persist in prayer always, especially when facing life's trials. Just as a marathon runner's body begs them to stop, their will urges them forward. So too in prayer, we must press on, even when our spirit feels dry or distracted. The devil works tirelessly to keep us from praying through subtle discouragements, diversions, and doubts. But remember: persistence beats resistance. As we persevere in prayer, just as water carved the Grand Caynon, so too will our soul be formed into the beautiful grace of God.
