


GET INVOLVED WITH ROOM IN THE INN


PRAY THE ROSARY



TONY'S REFLECTION

OUR SPIRITUAL WEAPON

Pope Leo XIV urged all Catholics to pray the rosary daily this month for a renewal of peace in our world. The secular world tends to view the rosary as a superstitious instrument deployed by pious old folks. Yet, the rosary is a great treasure bringing depth and precision as it assists in destroying false teachings all the while bringing souls closer to Christ. Here is where the story of the rosary becomes intriguing.

In the 13th century, the Albigensians passionately opposed the incarnation, the passion of Christ, and His resurrection as they believed that all matter is evil. As the heresy grew, their adherents became more brazen and violent. At one point, the Albigensians murdered a papal legate who had been sent from Rome to dialogue with them. St. Dominic felt called to combat this movement, but soon Dominic fell into anguish because his preaching was failing to defeat the heresy. After he had been praying and doing severe penances, The Blessed Mother appeared to St. Dominic with three angels and said, "Dear Dominic, do you know which weapon the Blessed Trinity wants to use to reform the world?" In holy awe and reverence, Dominic asked for enlightenment on what this weapon would be. Our Lady responded, "I want you to know that, in this warfare, the battering ram has always been the angelic Psalter, which is the foundation of the New Testament. Therefore, if you wish to reach these hardened souls and win them over to God, preach my Psalter."

The Marian Psalter was a prayer developed that involved praying 150 Hail Mary's divided into groups of 10 by Our Fathers. Prayer beads were used to keep track of the Hail Mary's. Mary revealed to St. Dominic which mysteries should be preached to correspond to the prayers: stories of Christ's life which directly contradicted the Albigensian heresy. After having been knighted by the Virgin with the spiritual sword, St. Dominic with renewed fervor helped conquer the heresy and won souls back to Christ's Church.

Here, we see that the sword God would infuse to strike down the false ideas of the world was the sacred mysteries of Christianity prayed in a rhymic manner. Given that our world is fraught with darkness, immorality, and a muddled-up notion of the faith, the rosary remains a powerful defense to cut through the confusion and allow Christ's light to shine. On a practical level the rosary is proven to deliver mental clarity. A new study found that those who prayed the rosary consistently held higher levels of mental health than those who don't.

This spiritual weapon that Our Lady introduced to St. Dominic is highly effective as a defense against outside errors attempting to penetrate the Church and the world. The rosary is also a tool to build up your interior castle of peace. God has established that the bookends of history involve a woman and her offspring conquering and crushing a serpent dragon (Genesis 3:15, Revelation 12). The woman is the Blessed Virgin Mary. Her offspring is Jesus Christ. The serpent dragon is the devil. As in any battle, victory comes through a weapon — the rosary. This month, let us utilize the rosary to combat errors and bring more souls back to Christ.


