
HAITI MARKET





TONY'S REFLECTION

Perseverance In Persecution

Mark Twain once wrote, "History doesn't repeat itself, but it often rhymes." What Twain is alluding to is that while unique events in history don't replicate themselves over again in an identical way, they often mirror each other with the same patterns. The same concept applies in the Bible, for Scripture is often interpreted through the lens of the past, present, and future. The stories and events in the Bible have an uncanny way of reverberating in our lives today.

In today's gospel, Jesus's discourse foretells the coming destruction of Jerusalem in language that invokes judgment in the form of natural disasters and warring nations. Jesus's words were confirmed a generation later, when the Romans sacked Jerusalem and burned the Temple to the ground in 70 A.D. The Temple held immense significance since it signified God's dwelling place in the center of the cosmos. Therefore, its annihilation carried a heavy significance—the old covenant makes way for the new.

Given that Jesus identified Himself as the Temple, the destruction of the Jewish Temple mirrored Christ's passion. Christ being put to a painful bodily death presaged the destruction of the Temple, which would manifest a dawning of a new age in salvation. Jesus foretells that emerging from this new epoch of salvation, His disciples will witness confusion, war, and intense persecution. Christ is showing us that what happened to Him will inevitably happen to His followers. While He was ridiculed, persecuted, and brought before government officials, His disciples will mirror (maybe not in an identical way) this experience. As Jesus bluntly told His followers, "If they persecuted me, they will persecute you."

Today, as in the days of the apostles, many false prophets masquerade as "influencers" in society. They sow confusion by promoting a lifestyle that appeals to our fleshly desires while inverting the Gospel message. It becomes tempting not to live your faith "on your sleeve" in a society that is hostile to the Gospel. Yet as disciples, we must fearlessly identify with Jesus despite opposition from the "influencers" of society. While receiving persecution for Christ sounds daunting, suffering provides opportunities to become a saint.

The culture war of ideas signifies that we, too, live at a time where kingdoms are at war—the kingdom of God against the secular kingdoms. Like the apostles, we must persevere in the face of unbelieving forces and authorities unreceptive to God.


What we do in life echoes in eternity, whether good or bad. To hold to the faith while under resistance to keep your faith "private" will yield fruit in eternity. In the end, Jesus assures the faithful, "By your perseverance you shall secure your lives." Perseverance is the virtue of fortitude that allows us to do the good under the duress of hardship. Let's pray at this Mass for God to grant us the perseverance we are going to need to endure the persecution that is brewing for us in this culture, in order that we remain faithful to the end.
