



TONY'S REFLECTION

LONG LIVE CHRIST THE KING

Some years ago, a movie about the struggle for religious freedom among Catholics in Mexico was released, titled "For Greater Glory." The movie tells the story of how the Communist government in Mexico was violently removing the Catholic faith from the people. The rallying cry of the persecuted Mexican believers was "Viva Cristo Rey!" "Long Live Christ the King!" For many of them, these were the last words out of their mouths before their violent deaths. Here, faithful men boldly proclaimed that Christ was King of the World, King of their lives, in the face of persecution and their looming death.

Today, we celebrate the Kingship of Christ. This feast proclaims what the Church has always believed: that Jesus Christ is not only our Savior but also our King, reigning now and reigning forever. The feast was instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI in response to the social, political, and cultural upheaval that followed World War I. In the years after the war, Europe was fractured—economies had collapsed, and the social landscape was teetering. As a result, people were turning away from traditional institutions, including the Church. Secular ideologies were gaining influence, and dictators like Mussolini, Stalin, and Hitler were beginning to rise. Pius XI recognized that people were placing their hope in political figures and ideologies, rather than in God. In response, he wrote the encyclical Quas Primas and established the Feast of Christ the King. His goal was to remind the faithful that Christ's authority extends beyond private religious devotion and into every part of our livespersonal, political, and societal. Christ is not merely King of our hearts; He is King of all creation.

Unlike the vast majority of human kings, Christ the King came to give up His life for His followers rather than protect it. In our gospel reading, the people have it backwards. They claim if He is truly King, God will save Him from death on the cross. So, they taunt Him. What they don't understand is that this King didn't come to save Himself, but to save them—and us. By the blood of His cross, Jesus reveals His Kingship—not in protecting His own life, but in offering it as a ransom for ours.

Interestingly, while one criminal dared Christ to save Himself, the other criminal humbled himself and cried out for repentance. Notice, he rebuked his fellow inmate and said, "Do you not fear God?" The good thief shows us how we are to approach Jesus—with reverence all the while confessing our sins and pleading for His salvation. The penitent thief, known through tradition as St. Dismas, then recognized Christ's kingship when he declared, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."

When we speak of Christ as King, we mean that He holds authority over all things, over nations and history, and over our minds, wills, and hearts. His kingship is not based on conquest or coercion, but on sacrificial love. Christ reigns not from a golden throne, but from the cross; His crown made of thorns.

Let us allow the title Christ as King to penetrate our psychology and permit Him to rule over us in every way.

FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION




