
CHRISTMAS TOY DRIVE

How To Advent

Advent sometimes just feels like the time that is sandwiched between Thanksgiving and Christmas – life is hectic with Christmas shopping, parties, the school year ending, and so much more. But as Catholics – we really ought to enter into this season of joyful anticipation with purpose and intention! In How to Advent, we will discover the rich traditions that mark this season and how they aid us in preparing our hearts for the birth of the child Jesus at Christmas. Guided by priests, religious, professors, and a charismatic host, you will gain practical tips and spiritual reflections on the practices of the Advent calendar, Advent wreath, Jesse tree, and nativity scene. There are four 12-15 minute episodes.

TONY'S REFLECTION

ALWAYS BE PREPARED

Any prominent athlete or musician can vouch that much of their time and effort is dedicated to constantly preparing for their big event. Successful people instinctively hone in on the key aspects of prep work to achieve their goals.

As the adage goes, "Success is 90% preparation and only 10% perspiration." Motivational speaker Zig Ziglar famously said, "Success is when preparation meets opportunity." Conversely, if people are lax in preparation, they'll inevitably experience their demise. The Harvard Business Review reports the primary reason new products fail is a lack of preparation.

In short, preparation can either make or break you. Therefore, it behooves one to not casually dismiss the significance of preparation. The same concept applies in the spiritual realm. This is why Jesus's words at the beginning of Advent highlight a constant vigilance to be ready. Being consumed in the ruckus of our fast-paced lives, our spiritual senses tend to become muddied up and see no glaring need for repentance. At this stage, Jesus warns that His spiritual reality will then catch us off guard. Faced with this dilemma, Jesus cautions us to always be on guard and remove complacency with a sense of holy urgency.

When Isaiah was writing in the 700s BC, northern Israel was near to being annihilated, and the Assyrians had reduced southern Judah to a small fragment of the kingdom of David. In Jerusalem itself, sincere worshipers of God were diminished, and the culture was dominated by "cultural" Yahwism mixed with paganism. It was a discouraging period for those wholly devoted to God, who found themselves outnumbered, powerless, and culturally impotent in the face of forces that seemed ready to extinguish any witness to the true God. Yet, during this bleak time Isaiah sees a vision of hope. In a similar vein, today's secular worldview creates a sterile atmosphere where the faithful cannot muster the joy and courage to raise enough children to replace themselves. Yet, Advent has us focus our attention on this coming hope by preparing for it.

Throughout the Scriptures, spiritual vigor is described as "wakefulness" or "alertness," whereas turning aside from God to seek pleasure in this present life is described as "sleep" or "drunkenness." Jesus uses the warning of the flood to Noah as a type of the end of the age—and reminds us to do what Noah did—prepare for it. As Jesus cautions, "They were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage." Here, Jesus invokes images of sensual indulgence alluding that most people will be distracted with pleasure-seeking in this life when the end comes. Knowing all this, one must segue into preparation mode.

Where preparation abounds, it will always stir one into a mission. As Advent begins, let us reflect upon how ready we are for Jesus's coming into our lives, coming to us this Christmas, and coming to us directly in the Eucharist. If you find you are not as prepared for Jesus as you'd like to be, make this Advent a time when you get your soul ready through prayer, spiritual exercises, reflection, and attentiveness to Him in the Mass.

YOUTH MINISTRY


MATT MAHER & SARAH KROGER BENEFIT CONCERT
