



TONY'S REFLECTION

MOVING TOWARD PURPLE

While people decorate their houses with the Christmas colors of red, green, and white, the prominent color of Advent remains distinctly different—purple. In the ancient world, purple was implausibly rare. The cost of purple dye was extremely expensive, not to mention time-consuming to make. Therefore, those who donned purple were held in high esteem, as purple was the pigment of choice for royalty and nobility. Given this expression of power, position, and wealth, it is no wonder that with the coming of Christ the King, the Church celebrates this season with purple.

Purple is also the first color seen as darkness gives way to light. The sky emits a purple glow as it transitions from the dark of night to the brightness of a new day. In anticipation of Christ's illumination of light coming into our lives, there too should be a shift in our souls—from darkness to purple, while eventually, our souls will don the white garment with Christ in heaven.

Whereas the color purple introduces the manifestation of a color change, John the Baptist is calling for a radical conversion of the whole person to God in preparation for our Lord's coming. In today's gospel, the prophet reverberates, "Prepare the way of the Lord." And how is John telling us to prepare? The first word John thunderously announces is "Repent!" The biblical word "repent" has a similar connotation to the modern phrase "reposition." Therefore, you prepare for Christ's coming through a dramatic repositioning of your soul away from sin and darkness and towards Christ, the light. By going from darkness to light, you experience the "purple" transition of the soul.

To trigger this repentance, one must take stock of their mental state and actions. Would you be comfortable if everyone knew your thoughts? Probably not. Recall that the father of the prodigal son allowed his son to wallow with the pigs so that he could recognize his sins. After repentance, the person must quickly segue into conversion. This conversion doesn't merely dabble in the faith, but heads deep into it. You cannot be a mere mish-mash of living for the world and living for Christ, for this conversion has us go from being a part-time Catholic to being a full-time Catholic. Yes, the Catholic faith temporarily inconveniences one's personal life because it binds you to go "all in" on a system of ethics built around it, whereas secular society lets you do what you want and be the authority of all ethical matters. Yet, living for the latter philosophy, one becomes caved in on himself. Here, he is hyper-focused on sensual pleasure, which inevitably places him in the degraded scene of the prodigal son—in the muck with animals. The crucial move is when the son had an about-face and flung his identity, his way of life, towards the Father.


The Lord wants us to prepare for His coming as an ordinary aspect of our daily Christian life. After all, the man who has his spiritual affairs in order shows no reason to panic when Christ enters the scene. So, let us move towards the purple light so we can be ready for the King.


ADVENT RETREAT
